Greeneville Theatre Guild's **Destination: Theatre Depot** campaign

The Board of Trustees of the Greeneville Theatre Guild (GTG) is conducting a renovation project on West Depot Street. The project consists of renovating portions of the buildings at 248 and 250 West Depot Street to create a new "black box-style" performance theatre, with flexible seating arrangements possible for each show. In conjunction with the project, the Board is also conducting the *Destination: Theatre Depot* fundraising campaign.

The performing space the GTG seeks to build is deliberately designed not to compete, but to complement existing venues. Where the Niswonger Performing Arts Center has over 1100 seats, and the Capitol has over 300 seats, the Theatre Depot will have just over 100 seats.

GTG is already using the building at the corner of Depot and Cutler streets for rehearsals, set construction, storage of costumes and props, etc. However, substantial renovation will be required to make a performance space with seating and restroom facilities for the public, heating and air conditioning, theatrical lighting and sound systems, lobby and ticket sales, dressing rooms for actors, etc. In the meantime, public presentation of GTG productions involves renting the Capitol Theatre on Main Street.

Once established, this performance space will:

- Contribute to the revitalization of downtown Greeneville.
- Allow GTG to have more flexibility in scheduling productions. Currently, plays can only be scheduled when the Capitol Theatre schedule permits GTG to rent that space.
- Allow actors to rehearse in the same space that they will perform.
- Allow sets to be constructed without having to dismantle and move them to another location.
- Allow greater intimacy. This will mean better sound and sight for theatre patrons.
- Allow GTG to present a variety of educational workshops and events for the community.
- Allow GTG to save substantial rental costs.

The GTG Board of Trustees has set a goal of \$500,000 for the campaign. A lead gift has already been committed to *Destination: Theatre Depot*. The children of John M. and Arne Jones have made a significant contribution to the GTG to launch its building campaign in honor of their parents. In recognition of and gratitude for the generous gift, the board of the GTG has decided that the auditorium will be named 'The John M. and Arne Jones Auditorium.' There are a variety of other naming opportunities in connection with the campaign.

GTG is a 501(c)(3) organization, so all contributions are tax deductible. With careful management by the Board and by the volunteer staff members, GTG has operated consistently in the black, with a balanced budget since its inception in 2014.


